

The University of North Carolina Herbarium (NCU) is offering paid internship opportunities to start in the summer of 2012 and last for the summer or beyond.

The selected candidates will learn herbarium curatorial techniques and conduct research on a collaborative or independent project involving the flora of the Southeastern United States, potentially including study of herbarium specimens, field studies, taxonomic issues in the Southeastern flora, bioinformatics, or flora writing.

Two or three positions total are available, with either the Charles T. Mohr Internship, established by descendants of leading Alabama botanist Charles Mohr (1824-1901), or the Mary McKee Felton internship, established by friends, family, and classmates of Mary Felton (1917-2001), former University of North Carolina Herbarium Assistant Curator.

Preference is given to current UNC-CH students (undergraduate or graduate) or recently graduated UNC-CH alumni.

Compensation will depend on candidate's qualifications and project duties.
